2017 BID THRESHOLDS



- Under Act 97 of 2011, the Department of Labor and Industry adjusts the bid threshold by percentage of change in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) each year. Three sections of the Pennsylvania School Code are affected by the annual adjustments, 24 P.S. §§1-119, 7-751 and 8.807.1
 - \$19,700 and above requires bidding for all furniture, equipment, textbooks, school supplies and other appliances for the use of the public schools.

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All construction, reconstruction, repairs, maintenance or work of any nature.

Exceptions - Professional services, includes legal, auditing, architect, banking, and other specialized services.

- Bids must be advertised once a week for three (3) weeks in not less than two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
- \$10,700 to \$19,699 requires three quotations, they can be written or telephonic and must be retained for three years
- Under \$10,700 no bids or quotes required

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NEW FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS UNIFORM GRANT GUIDANCE (UGG)



- Sealed bids for purchases over \$150,000.
- Goods/services from \$3,500 \$150,000 must obtain price or rate quotes from an adequate number of qualified sources.
- Micro purchases (less than \$3,500) may be awarded without soliciting competitive quotes if considered to be reasonable. Must distribute equitably among qualified suppliers.

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COOPERATIVE PURCHASING



Cooperative purchasing is permitted in Pennsylvania

- School Code 24 P.S. 5-521 allows district the authority to make cooperative purchases, if the
 cooperative purchases are in accordance with existing laws
- Allows school entities to purchase from state contracts
- Legally covers districts who exceed the thresholds in School Code
- A school district may purchase under a contract awarded by a public entity if that entity followed the law in awarding the contract

Applicable Laws

- Commonwealth Procurement Code COSTARS Allows school districts to purchase materials, equipment and supplies under contracts awarded through the Department of General Services.
- E-Government Act GSA Federal Schedule 70 allows school districts to purchase IT hardware and software.
- Intergovernmental Cooperation Law Allows school districts to purchase from county contracts in the county which they are located.

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COMMONWEALTH PROCUREMENT CODE CHAPTER 19, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS



Public agency - §1902

§ 1902. Cooperative purchasing authorized

A public procurement unit may either participate in, sponsor, conduct or administer a cooperative purchasing agreement for the procurement of any supplies, services or construction with one or more public procurement units or external procurement activities in accordance with an agreement entered into between the participants. The Department of General Services is authorized to enter into cooperative purchasing contracts solely for the use of local public procurement units or State-affiliated entities. The department shall enter into cooperative purchasing contracts for the use of local public procurement units or State-affiliated entities if the number of contractors under a previously existing contract for the same supply or service is reduced to a single contractor or reduced by more than 50% of the number existing on September 30, 2003, and shall award such contracts pursuant to section 517 (relating to multiple awards) using an invitation for bids. Nothing in this section shall prohibit a local public procurement unit or State-affiliated entity from participating in or procuring from other cooperative purchasing agreements awarded by the department. Cooperative purchasing may include, but is not limited to, joint or multiparty contracts between public procurement units and open-ended purchasing agency contracts which are made available to local public procurement units. (July 15, 2004, PL.703, No.77, eff. 60 days)

§ 1908. Compliance of public procurement units.

Where the public procurement unit or external procurement activity administering a cooperative purchase complies with the requirements governing its procurement of supplies, services and construction, any public procurement unit participating in the purchase shall be deemed to have complied with the requirements governing its procurement of supplies, services and construction. Public procurement units may not enter into a cooperative purchasing agreement for the purpose of circumventing this part. (Dec. 3, 2002, PL.1147, No.142, eff. ind.)

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PURCHASING CONSORTIUMS IN-STATE COOPERATIVE PURCHASING

COSTARS - is the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's cooperative purchasing program and serves as a conduit through which registered and eligible local public procurement units (LPPUs) and state-affiliated entities (Members) are able to leverage contracts established by DGS to cost effectively and efficiently identify suppliers with whom to do business.

You are able to negotiate with the vendors on COSTARS, you can work with the vendor to bring the pricing down from their published COSTARS pricing.

In November 2015 COSTARS added ancillary services back into their contracts. However the ancillary services are not stand-alone services, they must be in conjunction with products offered under the contract.

Important items to remember about the ancillary services.

- Ancillary Services, must be listed on the vendors COSTARS contract.
- They must be limited to the actual product or component parts purchased under the contract.
- If the combination of supplies and installation exceeds \$25,000, prevailing wage must be paid.
- You cannot use the State contracts for ancillary services.

What is a Purchasing Consortium

Why Do School Districts Opt to Use Purchasing Consortiums?

A purchasing consortium is a group of two or more entitles that come together for combining their purchasing power and volume as a means of obtaining more competitive pricing for the goods and services they require.

- Purchasing consortium pricing:

 *Contract generally reflects the maximum price
 *Is negotiable
 *More & more vendors participate
 *Allows for the use & flexibility of a Request for
 Proposal (RFP)
 *Some are competitively bid, others are not
 *Consortium pricing may not always be better
 than bid pricing but may create a balance in
 your purchasing approach
